ENVIRONMENT, RESOURCES & DEVELOPMENT COURT****1. SCOPE OF DETERMINATION**

This Determination applies to the undermentioned Members of the Judiciary and to the undermentioned Statutory Office Holders.

**2. SALARY****2.1 Members of the Judiciary**

2.1.1 The annual salaries and allowances for the members of the judiciary will be as follows:-

His Honour Judge WD Jennings whilst he performs the functions of both Senior Judge of the Industrial Relations Court and President of the Workers' Compensation Tribunal.	313,160
His Honour Judge Hannon whilst he performs the functions of both Judge of the Industrial Relations Court and President of the Industrial Relations Commission.	308,800
Other Judges of the Industrial Relations Court who hold joint commissions in the Australian Industrial Relations Commission and the Industrial Relations Commission of South Australia	293,900

2.1.2 Where a person is appointed as Acting Chief Justice of the Supreme Court or as Acting Chief Judge of the District Court and such appointment extends for a continuous period of more than one week, the person appointed shall be paid a salary equal to the salary specified herein for the Chief Justice or the Chief Judge, as appropriate, for the whole of the period the appointment is in effect.
